We need to be always watchful for those things that can divide us and split us as a community. We are to be sentries for the body of Christ, looking for trouble and defending the unity of the Church. For those who injure the body are to be shown how they may repair the damage caused. For the loss of one part of the body affects the whole and injures the whole.

Dear Friends

The month of September starts with not one but two great Marian feasts. On 8th September we celebrated the birthday of Mary and on 15th September we will remember Our Lady of Sorrows. These two Marian feasts surround and point to another great feast – the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The Cross – the stumbling block for the Jews and the folly for the Gentiles – is the prime example of how much we are loved by our God. He so loved the world that He gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. Jesus gave us an opportunity not to just live but an opportunity to live to the fullest.

Yes, it is this fact that we Christians exalt the cross that confuses so many. Why would someone exalt an instrument of torture? However, what we do is we rejoice that this instrument of torture, and a sign of human evil and malice, was transformed by God to a means of our redemption. At the same time, the cross is a great reminder to us of how real all this is. This historical fact makes us certain that God truly entered the world. The Son of God was walking the same earth we walk. He became human so that we might know that we are loved and that our God is not an observer from distance but a personal God who cares for us and wants us to be happy.

In Mary we see the greatest example of how to react and how to live knowing these great acts of God. She showed us the perfect response of humanity to God. The one who was redeemed first so that she could show us that only by following the will of God our true humanity comes out. It is sin that makes us less of who we truly are. It is sin that corrupts our true nature. Mary showed us the true beauty of humanity.

During the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows we are reminded of that prophecy of Simeon who told Mary that a sword would pierce her heart. This was to show us the Way, because the same way she walked the path from Nazareth to Calvary, so the Church must get from the water springs of baptism all the way to the Cross, where she dies with her Spouse. Mary helps us to understand what it means to participate in suffering and redemption. She helps us to understand what God has done for us. It is in the suffering of Mary that the Church can understand her own mission.

One's own participation, what is it? Von Balthasar asked this question, 'In the sacrifice of the Mass, what are you offering in the name of the Church, what are you renouncing?' No matter what is brought to the table what does it actually do? Is not Christ alone the sacrifice? It is in the actions of Mary where we can find the answer. Mary is present at the Calvary as a self-gift, consenting to the will of the Father by offering her Son. 'She would prefer a thousand times over to be tortured in his place. But this is not what is demanded of her; she has only to consent to it.' Therefore, let us also search for that will of the Father in our lives. What is it that God wants me to do? Everyone's mission is unique and thus it is up to us individually to find ours. What is the plan of God in my life? Perhaps the best way to go about it is to offer everything we do to our Father in heaven and start every day with that question – what do You want me to do today?
